



## FACULTY OF MEDICINE

The Faculty of Medicine at the University of British Columbia (UBC) admitted its first class in September 1950. The inaugural cohort of 60 students included 57 British Columbians of whom 20 were World War II veterans. UBC's first MD class graduated in 1954, including two women.

In the 1950s, UBC's Point Grey campus had no hospital facilities, clinical training took place off-campus at Vancouver General Hospital and other health centres designated as teaching hospitals. From these humble beginnings, province-wide distributed education became a hallmark of UBC, British Columbia's only medical school. Today's MD program enrolls 256 students annually in Vancouver, Victoria and Prince George and features nine clinical academic campuses and 13 affiliated regional centres located in hospitals throughout the province.

The Faculty of Medicine is composed of 31 departments, schools and research centres; trains nearly 2,600 undergraduate, graduate and postgraduate students; employs 570 full-time faculty, 1,500 staff and 3,500 clinical instructors; and has produced 9,000 alumni. It continues its 58-year tradition of facilitating innovative, evidence-based, student-centred learning that is relevant to the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

UBC's Faculty of Medicine provides innovative educational and research programs in the areas of health and life sciences through an integrated and province-wide delivery model. In 2004, a distributed expansion of the MD undergraduate program began to increase access for the public to physicians in both urban and rural areas across B.C., and to improve the health of B.C. residents. The program is now delivered in Vancouver, Prince George and Victoria.
