# The AFMC Student Questionnaires

## Pre-Clerkship Questionnaire National Report 2024



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*Note: The results presented in these data tables are based on the responses of a self-selecting sample from a census of MD students studying at a Canadian faculty of medicine. These responses should not be extrapolated to the entire medical student population. Percentages may not add to 100 due to rounding.*

## Introduction

The AFMC is pleased to present the AFMC Student Questionnaire 2024 – Pre-Clerkship Questionnaire (ASQ – PC) National Report. The ASQ PC is the result of the collaborative effort of medical educators, representatives from Canadian faculties of medicine, delegates of the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools (CACMS), students, and residents, supported by AFMC staff. The ASQ PC is part of the AFMC Student Questionnaires (ASQ) series of surveys.

The goal of the ASQ suite is to survey MD students at the most appropriate times during their MD journey. Learners are asked about their experiences upon entry with the MD Entry Survey, before clerkship with the Pre-Clerkship Survey and at the end with the Graduation Questionnaire. Learners are also asked to describe their experiences in their own words.

This report captures data obtained from the pre-clerkship cohort in 2024 and represents the middle of the ASQ cycle that will conclude in 2026 (or 2025 for 3-year schools) for undergraduate learners. Most faculties are already participating in all three surveys to provide a complete picture of the learner's journey through their program. AFMC is collaborating closely with the faculties who are not yet participating and proposing ways to accommodate their transition to ASQ. Thank you to all the faculties that have joined the ASQ and we eagerly await the remaining faculties to join this valuable initiative.

## Data Collection and Reporting

The target population for the 2024 AFMC PC was the 1509 students who were registered in active studies in the MD program at one of the following participating Faculties of Medicine: McMaster University, Memorial University of Newfoundland, Northern Ontario School of Medicine, Université de Montréal, University of Alberta, University of Calgary, University of Manitoba, University of Ottawa, , and Western University.

The 2024 AFMC PC was available in English and French and eligible students were e-mailed a unique, private link to gain access to the online survey. This customized URL was automatically generated by the online survey platform. Neither the AFMC nor the schools can link a student to their URL. In this way, participants were ensured anonymity.

A questionnaire was considered completed if a respondent consented to the terms of the questionnaire and submitted the questionnaire. We received 569 completed questionnaires, for a national response rate of 37.7%.

To uphold rigorous standards of participant anonymity and the confidentiality of responses, only aggregate data are reported by AFMC. The AFMC produces a publicly available national report, combining data from all schools. Each faculty is also provided with a report that aggregates responses at the faculty and, if applicable, campus levels. These reports are not publicly disseminated by AFMC. No report is issued if there are fewer than 10 respondents for that reporting level (e.g., if a campus has fewer than 10 respondents). Faculty response rates ranged from 21.2% to 85.2%.

Responses to questions about finances or research experience could, on their own, reveal information about the identity of a respondent. For this reason, no results are reported when fewer than 5 respondents selected a response option for these questions.

Individual-level data will not be made publicly available by the AFMC. Clean and de-identified data are available to participating faculties upon request.

### Interpretation of Results

Results obtained are not based on a random sample and respondents were self-selecting. For this reason, extreme caution must be applied when performing comparisons or drawing conclusions based on this non-random sample.

When appropriate, standard deviations of the results are presented. This statistic is useful to assess the distribution of the answers to a question. The standard deviations in this report are not meant to be used to build confidence intervals or infer statistical significance.

## Selected Findings

### **When asked how many attended Pre-Clerkship courses/lectures, students marked “most of the time”.**

When asked how many attended Pre-Clerkship courses/lectures (In-person), 69.1% of students indicated that they attended “most of the time”. An increase from 48.7% in 2023.

### **More students have participated in research projects or other scholarly activities with faculty members.**

When asked if they participated in research projects or other scholarly activities with faculty members, whether it was required for a course or self-initiated, 85.4% answered yes. An increase from 78.4% in 2023.

### **When asked how satisfied they are with programs/activities that promote effective stress management, a balanced lifestyle, and overall well-being.**

When asked how satisfied they are with programs/activities that promote effective stress management, a balanced lifestyle, and overall well-being, 64.5% were satisfied, and 14.3% were very satisfied. An increase from 58% satisfied and 10.9% very satisfied in 2023.

### **When asked if they were aware of their schools’ policies regarding the mistreatment of medical students.**

When asked if they were aware of their schools’ policies regarding the mistreatment of medical students, 96.1% answered yes. An increase from 94.8% in 2023.

### **When asked if debt levels are affecting their stress levels.**

When asked if debt level was affecting their stress levels, 72.1% answered yes and 28% answered no, which isn’t a dramatic change from 2023 numbers which were: 72.6% answered yes, and 27.4% answered no.

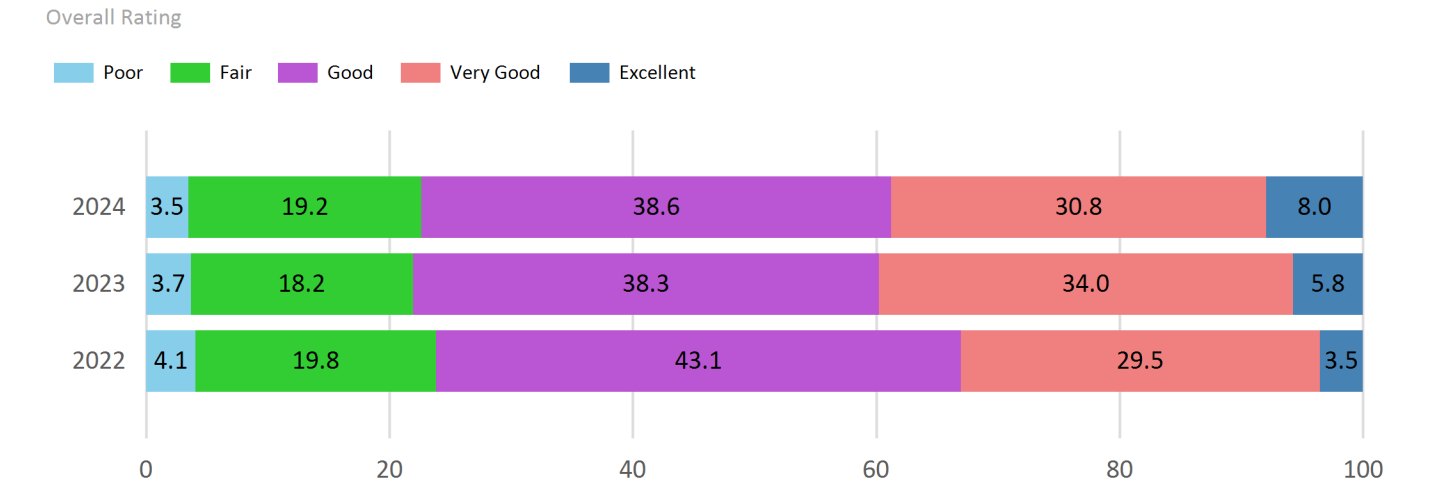

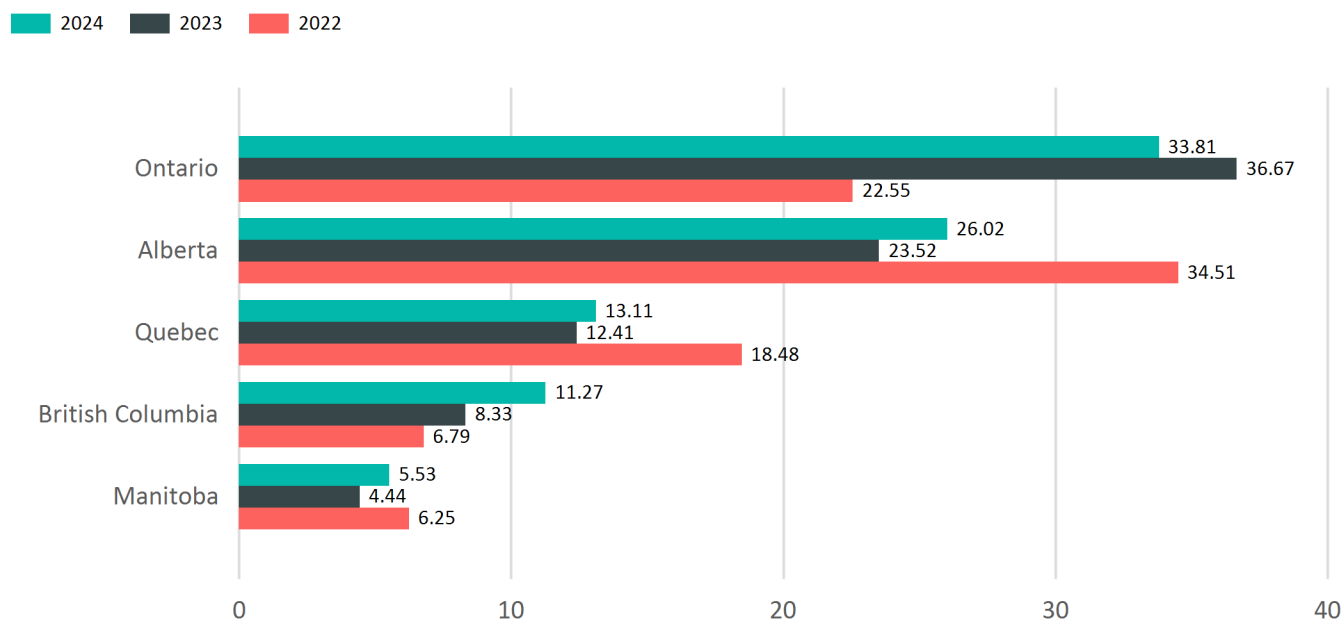

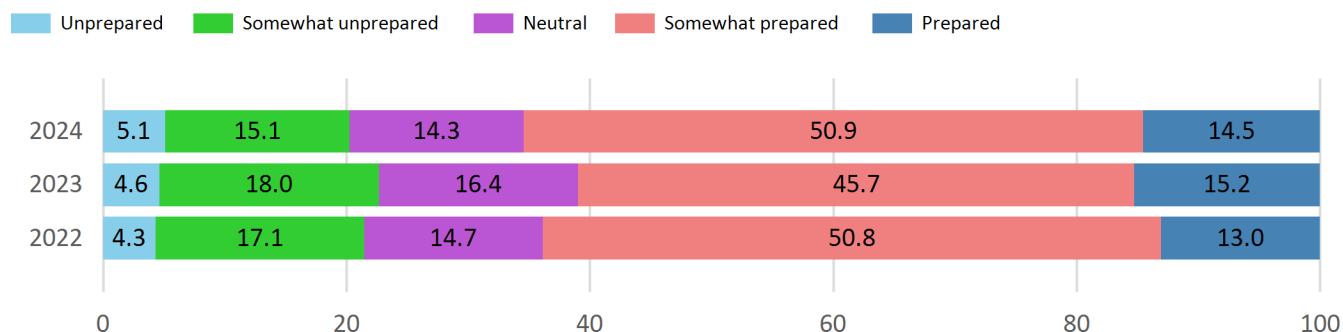

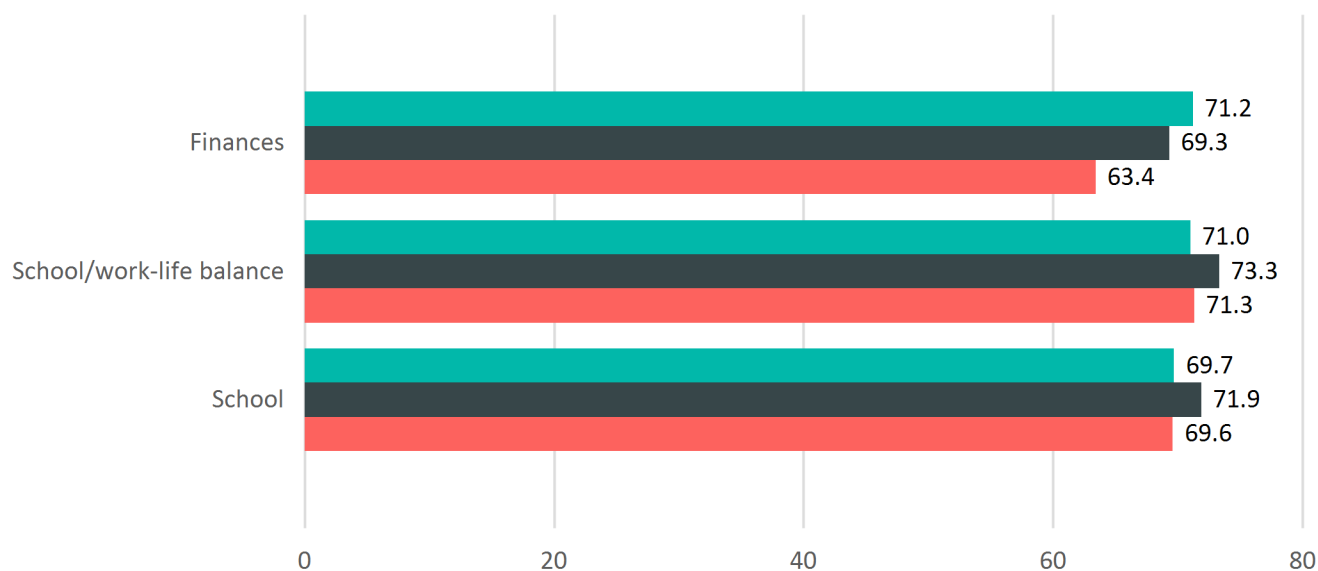
